Summer 1 Curriculum Overview

Maths

In maths, children will be exploring 3D shapes and repeated patterns. Children will also go onto explore numbers 11–20 in greater detail. Children will become more familiar with numbers beyond 10 and the pattern of numbers to 20.



'1 ten and 1 is 11'



'1 ten and 2 is 12'

Children will also continue revisiting their number bonds within 5

$$3 + 2 = 5$$

Writing

This half-term we will continue to teach the correct grip in which the children should hold their pencils, as well as encouraging correct letter formation.

The children will continue using colourful semantics to orally rehearse sentences. Children will be encouraged and supported to write short sentences with a capital letter and full stop.

Early Reading

The children will continue with the phonics scheme: Little Wandle Letters and Sounds. The children will be applying their phonic knowledge during their reading sessions, which includes oral blending and the decoding of words. Children will be encouraged to 'blend in their head' to build their fluency when reading. They will also be encouraged to identify their tricky words and read them confidently. Please continue listening to your child read their phonetically decodable book daily.



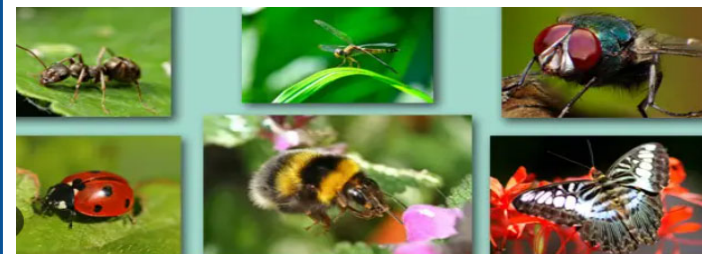
