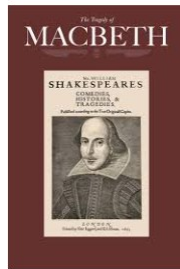

In Reading, we will be learning about:

Shakespeare

This term, Year 6 will be exploring the works of **William Shakespeare** through an exciting introduction to his life, language and stories. Pupils will read and discuss a range of Shakespearean texts, with a particular focus on *Macbeth*. Through reading, speaking, writing and drama activities, children will develop their understanding of Shakespeare's themes, characters and plots while building confidence in comprehension, vocabulary and performance. This unit will provide a strong foundation for studying classic literature and help pupils develop a deeper appreciation of one of England's most influential writers.



In Maths, we will be learning about:

In Maths, we will be practising some key areas that we will need in Year 7. Firstly, we will develop our data handling skills and focus on how to collect and present a range of data in bar charts, pie charts, line graphs and pictograms. Then, we will move onto practising using algebra and pattern-spotting, before finishing the year with some real-life maths skills around time, money and budgeting.



In Writing, we will be learning about:

In writing, we will be applying our Year 6 skills to several final pieces of writing:

- Alma: a ghost story around a little girl who makes a shocking discovery in a creepy, old doll shop. A doll that looks just like her, but when she finally gets inside and touches the doll, she may regret her choice...
- Rose Blanche: a story set during the Second World War about a girl who explores the woods near her town. After venturing to the outskirts of the woods, she makes a startling discovery—a camp full of cold, hungry children, who need Rose's help.

Our curriculum project is: The Americas

Our main subject we will be focusing on is: Geography

This term, Year 6 will be exploring **North and South America**. Pupils will learn about the countries, capitals and physical features of the Americas, including mountains, rivers and climates. They will also investigate human geography, such as major cities, population and economic activities, and compare different regions of the Americas with the United Kingdom. Throughout the topic, children will develop their map-reading skills and deepen their understanding of how people and environments interact across the world.



In Art, we will be learning about:



This term in Art, Year 6 will be exploring **Sculpture and 3D Art** through the theme “**Making Memories.**” Pupils will investigate how artists use three-dimensional materials to capture memories, experiences and emotions. They will develop their skills in designing, shaping and constructing sculptures using a range of materials, while learning about texture, form and structure. Children will have the opportunity to create their own meaningful 3D artwork inspired by special memories and personal experiences.

In French, we will be learning about:

We will be learning about how to say a variety of speech to help when wanting to go shopping.



In Music, we will be learning about:

We will be learning about the music genre of musical theatre, with a focus on improvisation using instruments and continue practising our brass instruments.



In P.E, we will be learning about: Rounders

This term, Year 6 will be developing their skills in **Rounders**. Pupils will learn the rules of the game, improve their throwing, catching and batting techniques, and develop teamwork and communication skills. They will also explore tactics and strategies to help them play effectively in competitive game situations while promoting good sportsmanship and fair play.

In P.S.H.E / R.H.E, we will be learning about:

This term, Year 6 will, also, explore key themes to support their transition into adolescence and prepare for secondary school.

- **My Self-Image** – Children will reflect on how they see themselves and what shapes their self-image, building confidence in their unique strengths.
- **Real and Ideal Self** – Children will consider how outside influences, such as social media, can affect self-perception, and will be encouraged to value their authentic self.

These lessons aim to build confidence, promote emotional well-being, and support a strong sense of identity.

In R.E, we will be learning about:

In RE, we will be focusing on the units “Being Courageous and Confident” and “Responding to Suffering”. Both of these units will develop key skills for our transition to secondary school.

In Computing, we will be learning about:

In computing, we will be using Purple Mash to learn about coding and writing algorithms to create online adventure games.
